

# Rate change is effective February 1

RMLD has implemented an approximate 4.5% increase (varies slightly by rate class and usage) to its overall bill to align closer to the approved FY 14 Budget.

"The necessity of the increase is a result of a diligent review of budget to actuals which delineated a shortfall of revenues due to unrealized load growth projections over the last several years," said General Manager Coleen O'Brien. "It is with fiduciary duty that this matter was proactively addressed to maintain reliability and to show consistency in its rate of return for the purposes of solid financial positioning, continued excellent low credit risk for both RMLD and the Town of Reading, and to ensure that RMLD remains attrac-

tive to low cost power suppliers."

RMLD will continue to have amongst the best reliability and lowest rates in the state with the increase. The longer-term solution includes a full Cost of Service Study, due later this spring, and a Long Term Strategic Plan that focuses on rates, staffing, process efficiencies and reliability.

To assist in keeping your bill its lowest, RMLD's residential time-of-use rate can save you money if you're able to shift much of your home's power use away from on-peak hours, which are noon to 7 p.m., weekdays excluding holidays.
